TADA..... WE NEED YOUR HELP!!!!

Most of you know Benji Smith from the youth dart program in TADA. You may have seen him at the Virginia Beach Classic and Virginia States. On Sept. 30 Benji and his girlfriend, Katie, had a son. His name is Kaleb. He was born approx. 12 weeks early. He only weighed 1 pound 14 ounces, and is only 13 inches long. He is in the Natal ICU at the University of Virginia Medical Center. So far he is doing very well. He can breathe on his own, but is sometimes on a breathing tube to help him struggle a little less.

The hospital is 60 to 70 miles round trip for each of the families. There are sometimes 2 trips a day. He is expected to stay in the hospital for at least 2 months. Not only is this very stressful and emotional for everyone, it is also causing financial hardship. Benji is only 17. As a senior in high school, working hard to better himself for his son, a job would leave no time to visit Kaleb.

It's well known that whenever a member of the "dart family" is in need we pull together to help them. I am humbly asking for that help on behalf of my son, Benji.
